

# Tatamagouche & Area

The vibrant community of Tatamagouche (native Mi'kmaq word meaning "meeting of waters") is a unique area where the old and the new exist in harmony. A village of Victorian homes, long established businesses, and a slow traditional way of life mix with modern living and new facilities. Restaurants, gift and craft shops dot the main street, while local museums display the history and culture of the community.

The **Fraser Cultural Centre** offers visitors a connection to the community's art and culture through its art gallery and exhibits.


In Tatamagouche the old railway bed traveling through the village has been converted to a **multi-use trail** enjoyed year round by **cyclists, hikers, snowmobilers and cross country skiers**. The trail stretches from the **Nelson Park** over the French River and along the shores of the Waugh River, passing historical sites along the way, such as the **Tatamagouche Creamery** and the **Old Inter-Colonial Railway Station** (one of the oldest in Canada).

The Tatamagouche Creamery Square is a dynamic

community waterfront/heritage development project. Every Saturday morning, visitors can experience the "Something for Everyone" theme of the vibrant Tatamagouche **Farmers' Market**. As well, mid-June will see the grand opening of an exciting Museum & Archives facility in the historic and newly renovated Creamery building. This interactive facility will educate and entertain as it presents professionally designed exhibits featuring: the 290 million year old fossils from the **Brule Fossil Collection**; the life of 7' 11" Nova Scotia Giantess **Anna Swan** including her world tour with PT Barnum's American Museum; the rich local history of this area from the **Sunrise Trail Museum** collection; a new exhibit on the operation of the Creamery; and a Resource Centre for historical and genealogical research which includes the **North Shore Archives**.

Throughout the year **special events and festivals** highlight the community's traditions and way of life. From levees, picnics, musical events, lobster suppers and, maple and berry harvest festivals to a popular **Oktoberfest**, visitors will find a warm welcome.

Water sport enthusiasts will enjoy a number of activities on the Tatamagouche Bay. **Kayaking, canoeing, swimming, wind surfing, boating and sailing** are all popular activities. In nearby Brule there are plenty of warm sandy beaches including **Rushton's Beach Provincial Park**. Brule also has a **marina and yacht club** (offering moorings for larger sailboats and yachts), a **lobster pound**, and a pleasant seaside **9-hole golf course**.

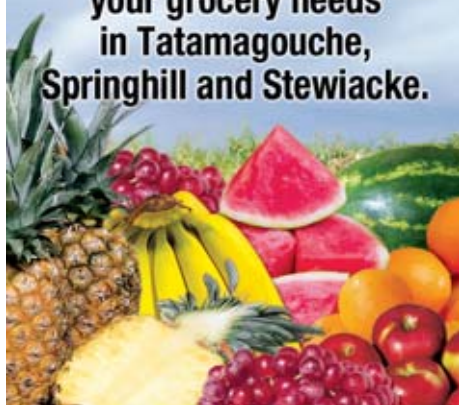
